# Plants – Year 1

Key vocabulary	
<b>leaf</b>	These are flat, thin and usually green.
<b>flower</b>	The part of a plant that is often brightly coloured.
<b>petal</b>	Thin, brightly coloured or white part of the flower.
<b>fruit</b>	Fleshy part of a plant that contains seeds or a stone.
<b>root</b>	The part of the plant that grows under the ground.
<b>seed</b>	Small part of a flowering plant that grows into a new plant.
<b>trunk</b>	Large main stem of a tree.
<b>branch</b>	Part of a tree that grows out from the trunk.
<b>stem</b>	The upright main stalk of a plant.
<b>bark</b>	The outer covering of a tree trunk.

Significant scientist	
<b>Wangari Maathai</b> (1940-2011) 	Wangari Maathai was a Kenyan environmentalist who began a movement to plant trees and re-forest her country.  She was the first African woman to win a Nobel Peace Prize.

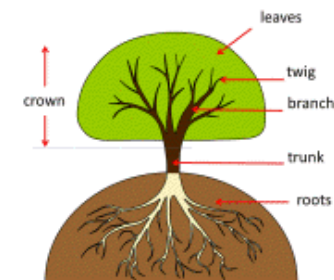
## Deciduous and evergreen trees
